#### THOUGHT FOR THE SOUL

It is said that when you are good at making excuses, it's hard to excel in anything else. In today's Gospel, Jesus tell a parable about a king who invited people to his son's wedding banquet but they all failed to turn up, making excuses. Some even seized, maltreated and killed the messengers. Understandably, the king was furious. In a fit of rage, he killed those people and burnt down their city. Consequently, he threw the part open to all but had to throw out a man who came in without a wedding garment. The king might be seen as overreacting and it can be difficult to associate him with God as the parable intended. But, in the land of the deaf, you have to shout to be heard. Such exaggerated narratives are necessary to shake up a society that has lost the sense of God.
