### THOUGHT FOR THE SOUL

A woman climbed up into the bus and sat down close to a man, hitting him with her heavy and dirty bag. Surprisingly the man neither complained nor showed ill feelings. When the man remained silent, the woman asked him why did he not complain when she hit him with her bags. The man replied with a smile,"Tthere is no need to be upset about something so insignificant as our journey together is so short, because I am getting off at the next stop."

Everybody in the bus was stunned by the man's response and I think there is a big lesson for everyone.
